

Sidney Williams, 82, Of Throop Succumbs

Sidney Williams, 82, of 607 Edgar St., Throop, a retired civil and electrical engineer and former superintendent of the Olyphant Power Plant, died yesterday in State General Hospital after a long illness. He leaves 110 survivors.

Born in South Wales, he came to this country 74 years ago and lived in Throop 25 years. A veteran of service with the British Army, Mr. Williams had been outside foreman at the Underwood Colliery, Pennsylvania Coal Co., Throop, at one time, and was a former musician here. He was a member of the Masons in this city. His wife, the former Elizabeth Owens, died a number of years ago.

Surviving are four daughters, Mrs. Isaiah Williams, Chicago, Ill.; Mrs. Thomas A. Hayes, Brooklyn, N.Y.; Mrs. Arthur H. Sossong Jr., Tuscon, Ariz., and Mrs. Thomas G. Bohn, Throop; two brothers, John, Dickson City, and Stanley, Berlin, Mich.; a sister, Mrs. Catherine Snyder, Washington, D.C.; six sons, Joseph, Atlantic City, N.J.; Sidney Jr., Claymont, Del.; Isaiah, Chicago; Clayton, New York City; James, Bridgeport, Conn., and Chester, Colonia, N.J.; 37 grandchildren and 60 great-grandchildren.
